Basilica of Saint Andrew, Roanoke

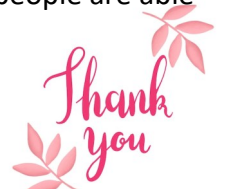

A donation to your church can reduce your income taxes. Taxpayers of any age can claim an itemized deduction for donations to charities. However, many people stopped *itemizing* deductions around 2018 when the tax law greatly increased the *standard* deduction. However, if you are at least age 70½ and have an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you are allowed to make a direct transfer (called a **Qualified Charitable Distribution** or QCD) from that account to a charity, and that amount *will not be included* in your reportable income. Ordinarily, any amount you withdraw from a regular IRA is fully taxable income, but this special kind of QCD transfer will reduce your income and therefore reduce your tax, even if you take the standard deduction. It also can help reduce state income taxes when your federal gross income amount is copied onto your state tax form.

This QCD transfer technique is especially valuable for people who must take money out from their IRA to meet the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) rules. Interested? Just contact your financial institution and they will help you follow the correct process for converting all or part of your RMD to a QCD. By the way, this process works for an IRA only, not for a 401-k or 403-b account. However, most people are able to rollover one of these accounts into an IRA.
