FINANCIAL UPDATE: We started the new Fiscal Year 2026 on July 1. In April and May, the members of the Parish Finance Council developed the new yearly budget based on how much we need to *spend* and therefore how much we need as *income* from the collections for the upcoming year. Those two figures, income and expense, have to be the same in order for the budget to balance. Unlike our federal government, we must "pay as we go" for all our expenses without borrowing the money.

At the top of our minds was the fact that our collection income for FY 2025 had been running considerably below budget, so raising that figure for 2026 was not realistic. Therefore, we went through expense items one at a time and cut everything we could, but other items had to be raised because of increases from vendors or from the Diocese. We ended this difficult process with our Regular Offertory at St. Jude slightly decreased from \$155,000 to \$154,650. The Repair and Maintenance Collection is reduced from \$22,000 to \$13,000. Therefore, our new weekly goal for the Regular Offertory is \$2,974 and the weekly goal for R&M is \$250. The Shrine's Regular Offertory goal is increased from \$21,180 to 28,502 or \$548 per week, partly because they are reimbursing St. Jude for a larger share of the priest's expenses.

Thank you for your continued support and commitment to our parish. Your continued support is essential for the parish to thrive.

To ensure the effective carrying out of pastoral ministries and service to the community, it's necessary to address rising parish administration costs, and our prevalent budget deficits as it has been made known to you through our weekly bulletins.

We are averaging a shortfall of better than \$4,000 per month to maintain viable parish operations. This cannot be subsidized by the remaining funds in the St. Jude investment account for longer than the 2025 – 2026 fiscal year. If the scenario is not corrected, the we could lose our full time staffing (priest and bookkeeper) in a year due to the inability to pay our expenses. This is our home and we must all work to keep it open and available for use.

We have been doing our best with fiscal prudence in the midst of this situation. Moreover, Father Mensah has been given the permission by the Pontifical Mission Society of the Diocese to visit two large parishes to make an appeal for funds for two weekends in November this year.

A joint meeting of the Finance Council and the Parish Council was held on June 19, in an effort to try and resolve this situation. 3 areas were examined. They included donations, expenses and fundraiser options. It will take a combination of efforts in all of these areas in order to bring our budget to a point that St. Jude can remain viable in the foreseeable future.

We must begin with our current donations (offerings). A starting point would be to ask all parishioners to search their hearts and souls to determine if an increase in their current donations is feasible. We are suggesting a 20% increase as a starting point for a 4-month trial to determine the impact that would have. Examples would be making the following changes. If you donate \$1, make it \$1.20. If \$10, make it \$12. If \$100, make it \$1200. I am sure you get the picture. Please examine your personal situation and determine if you can make this type of commitment. Of course, if you feel you can make a larger increase in your donation, please do. We have to do our best

We came up with a list of changes that could be made to reduce our expenses. They include changes in our use of lighting, heating and cooling of the building. We ask that everyone only turn on lights that are necessary and turn off lights when they leave an area that they have been using. That would minimize having to employ energy police. Please begin to dress appropriately for modest temperature changes in the building.

We also plan to challenge every request for purchases. This will include making do without items we routinely purchase, postponing the purchase to a later date, reducing the number of items we may have typically purchased in the past, and asking for donations of paper goods and other consumables. A list of needed items will be posted in the near future so that we can bring in items that are routinely used in the social hall. Activities such as Birthday celebrations or Friday Lenten dinners must become self-sustaining. Other activities may carry an entrance fee. Old style votive candles have been found in storage and they are being put in use to postpone buying new ones for the near future. We will be aggressively pursuing these options.

In order for fundraisers to be successful, we must begin to draw in the community to participate with these so that the total burden is not solely on our parishioners to provide funds. 21 different ideas were fielded for fundraisers. We will evaluate those that require little up-front money first. Some ideas included are pursuing requests for contributions of goods or moneys from local businesses. A market fair could draw in members of the community and be paired with raffles, bake sales and selling of simple lunches or dinners. Dinners or classes that celebrate our cultural diversity could be held. (Who wouldn't want to learn how to cook a Samoan, Filipino, Indian or good old southern dish?) Offering classes in current technology, such as Snap chat or other social media use or specialty cooking skills. Many of these ideas will be implemented as manpower and time allows. We will be asking for your time and effort as we begin to plan and execute some of the events.

If you have other suggestions that will allow us to reduce expenditures or raise funds, please speak with Maria Sing who is maintaining the list of ideas generated by the Councils.

This is certainly not the news that any of us want to hear. We are asking that each of you find a way to help. Our generosity allows the continuation of our parish mission and provides a strong foundation for the parish's future.
